Page Left Margin

A page have a height and width. Text area have four margins, top, bottom, left and right. A text page consists of paragraphs. A paragraph consists of sentences. A sentence consists of words. A word consists of letters. Like a page each paragraph has spacing on the top, bottom, left and right. A paragraph ends with a linefeed/carriage return. A paragraph can be aligned left, right, and center horizontally. You can change the space between a line and the next using Line Leading. A Word-wrap is the process that when a line text becomes longer than the space of a line in a page, text automatically goes to the next line. In iText there are two extra text classes called Chunk and Phrase. A Chunk should not complete a line, because it cannot do a word wrap. A Phrase can do a word wrap, and a Chunk does not.
